

My dear and respected devotees Jai Seeta Ram Radhe Radhe, Guru Charan Kamalbhyo Namahah.

Today we are talking about Guru Purnima also known as Vyasa
Purnima which normally occurs in July on the Full moon day of Ashadh
in the Hindu Calendar

As we all know the full moon day is very auspicious (See previous lecture) and on this occasion there is even more auspiciousness.

On this day Saints starts their special austerities called Chaturmas which means saints choose a place away from their hermitage in the rainy season to perform their penance. This is a very difficult time to do penance.

Guru Poornima or Vyaasa Poornima celebration is the appearance of Vyaas Jee, the writer and divider of the Vedas, the Puranas and other religious texts.

When Lord Brahma realized that human knowledge was declining on earth due to difficulty knowledge contained in the Vedic scriptures he manifested himself in the form of Veda Vyaasa, as the son of Sage Parashar and a fisherman's daughter named Satyawati, grandson of Saint Shakti, great grandson of Vishaitha, the Guru of Bhagwan Rama and the great great grandson of Brahma Himself.

Vyaas Jee collected all the Hymns of The Vedas and gave them a standard form and accent and divided them into four parts, basing these on their use in the sacrificial rites as Rig Veda, Yajur Veda Saam Veda and Atharva Veda, which he taught to his four chief disciples Paila, Vaishampayam, Jaimini and Sumantu. This achievement made him to be called Veda Vyaas, the editor and divider of the Vedas.

Veda Vyaas was dark in complexion and was called Krishna. He also did severe penance n BadriNath and was called Vadraayana. His full name was Krishna Dvaipaaayan Vaadrayaan Veda Vyaasa and the histories and Puranas were called the fifth Veda.

Hindus always relate worship of Bhagwan with various times and incidents of Nature and full moon has special significance as well, since it is a complete illumination. Guru Purnima then signifies a spiritual illumination and Veda Vyaas became to be worshipped on this day.

Adi Shankharaya says in Geeta Mahatammya Namostu Te Vyaas Vishal Buddhe Phullar a VIndayat Patra Netra Yen Tvaaya Bharat Tail Poorna Prajwaalito Gyan mayah Pradeepah

Vyaas's most popular scripture in the Hindu world is the Mahabharata, which contains Shreemad Bhagwad Geeta and can be summarized as follows

Yato Dharmah Tato Jayah which means that wherever there is righteousness there will be victory as Bhagwad Geeta tells us in Chapter 18 verse 78.

Yatra yogeshwarah krishno yatra paartho dhanurdharah;
Tatra shreervijayo bhootirdhruvaa neetirmatirmama. Wherever there is
Krishna, the Lord of Yoga, wherever there is Arjuna, the archer, there
is always prosperity, happiness, victory and firm policy; such is my
conviction.

Devotees the word Guru is derived from two syllables GU and Ru and these two words have different meanings For example

- 1. Gu means Darkness and Ru means The illuminator
- 2. Gu means Courage and Ru means agitator
- 3. Gu means knowledge and Ru means illusion
- 4. Gu means sickness and Ru means Healer
- 5. Gu means ignorance and Ru means remover of ignorance

Therefore a Guru is someone who can remove all obstacles in the spiritual growth of an individual and has a special place in one's life. It is for this reason that all scholars, disciples and followers of all sects of Hinduism celebrate Guru Purnima as a way of remembering and thanking their Gurus.

My dear ones Hindus attach paramount importance to their spiritual Gurus, who are equated with Bhagwan and is seen as the link to GOD, nd the link between the individual or mortal being with the immortal. Just as the moon shines by reflecting the light of the Sun and glorifies it, all disciples can gain knowledge from their Gurus as we resitevery often the following Slokha

Guru Brahma Guru Vishnu Guru Dewa Maheshwarha Guru Sakshat ParamBrahmah Tasmai Shree Guruve Namaha.
